But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

"You heard me say, I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe. I will not say much more to you, for the prince of this world is coming. He has no hold over me, but he comes so that the world may learn that I love the Father and do exactly what my Father has commanded me.

Last month the longest season of the church year began—Pentecost, the season that celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the next four months we'll dwell in Pentecost. Green is the liturgical color for this season, and it represents growth—our growth in the Holy Spirit.

We know that summer is a

busy time of the year, with outdoor activities, travel, and time with friends and family abounding. That's great, and we should enjoy the abundance of God's gifts throughout this season as well as what the rest of the year has to offer. But there's another side of Pentecost, when the gift of the Holy Spirit was given to Jesus' followers. And the timeless message is here and true for us today. This is the season of the church year and an opportunity for us to reflect on our spiritual state. It's a time to think about how we can grow in our faith and service. Goodness knows there are may opportunities to do so-and you don't have to go far to find them. Trinity's location puts it in a neighborhood that abounds with service opportunities. Some of those take place with the smoke-out planned for this weekend. Some will take place beginning later this month when Trinity hosts a monthly (at least to start with) meal-an opportunity for those who live nearby to join for an hour of food, beverage, and community.

By the time you've read this, you probably have already heard about what's going on, either through council meetings, announcements before worship, or committee efforts such as witness/ outreach has been organizing. I encourage you to consider stepping outside your comfort zone and joining the effort to reach out and give a few hours of your time and talent to help serve your neighbor.

Update from the Call Committee

The Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was completed in March and approved by the Church Council and the ELCA Central States Synod office.

The MSP is a dozen pages of data and narrative answers to questions in a standardized ELCA form. The Call Committee built on the work done last summer and fall by the Transitional Task Force including the Town Hall meetings. Additional data was gathered from the "Who are we this Sunday?" form distributed during a November church service and other resources. What this means is anyone interested in the ministry opportunity at Trinity can look at our profile and notify the Synod of their interest. The Synod staff is also looking to identify possible candidates. Nationally, the pool of candidates is smaller than the number of positions. Now is a good time for the congregation to pray that God sends to us the person we need.
