A Note from Council President Bob Horton

After meeting with Andrew Patty on the evening of November 15 at TLC, the Council voted unanimously on November 18 to recommend him to the entire congregation. We have Andrew scheduled to visit TLC on December 9 and also will schedule a special congregational meeting (possibly December 30) to vote on extending a call to fill our pastoral vacancy. We will share additional details in pre-service announcements and group emails.

Andrew is preparing a profile to share with all of us that will expand on the following information:

Grew up in the foothills of the Smokey Mountains outside Knoxville, Tennessee.

Was the first in his family to attend college, receiving a BA in History and Music from The University of the South: Sewanee (a small liberal arts school of the Episcopal Church). While there he was very involved in missions and the college choir.

Attended Duke Divinity School and became a member of the United Church of Christ. Graduated with his Masters in Divinity from Duke in 2016 with concentrations in *Christian Education* and *Gender and Sexuality in Theology and Ministry*.

Is in the third year of his PhD program at the University of Kansas in the School of Cultural and Social Studies of Education at the School of Education. He is doing research about faith formation for college students.

This is an exciting time for our church family. I appreciate your commitment of Time, Talents, and Treasures as we put our full trust in God and listen closely to where He is calling us. We pray for God's continued guidance as we work through these tasks. Take care.

This year has presented many challenges for Doorstep, and thankfully many blessings. Since we ended 2017 with fewer financial gifts than in the past, we have struggled with agency expenses, and grant funds that work on reimbursement throughout the year. And, now here we are back at December and working on our annual Christmas Store. We have requested 260 households from the Christmas Bureau this year. There will be 800+ individuals in these households, and we are committed to helping them with Christmas gifts and food.

To do this, we need your help! We collect clothing, household items, blankets, school supplies, hygiene items, decorations, and more throughout the year. We did not have the funds to do clearance shopping for winter clothing in the first quarter of this year. Therefore, we have less clothing for all ages saved for the Store.

We are greatly in need of new winter clothing for infants & toddlers, youth, boys & girls, sizes 6-16, women and men. Women like sweat sets, pajama pants & tops & long nightgowns. Men can use sweat sets, long sleeved shirts & boxer briefs (all sizes). All children

receive an outfit and a set of pajamas. The youth section, sizes 6-16, is the largest age range we help, and we always have to buy clothing in these sizes to cover the children we have adopted.

We also need toys for all children, and gifts for teenagers. And monetary gifts help cover the food expenses of the Christmas Store, which is the largest expense.

The Christmas Store will be open the week of December 9th – 13th. We need volunteers each day. Flyers have been distributed with the dates shops with an escort. We schedule 19 households per hour during distribution, so we need volunteer escorts!

You can bring donations for the Doorstep Christmas Store, Monday – Friday from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. We are located at 1119 SW 10th Avenue (10th and Buchanan), or to your church. Donated items for the Store are needed by Monday, December 10th!

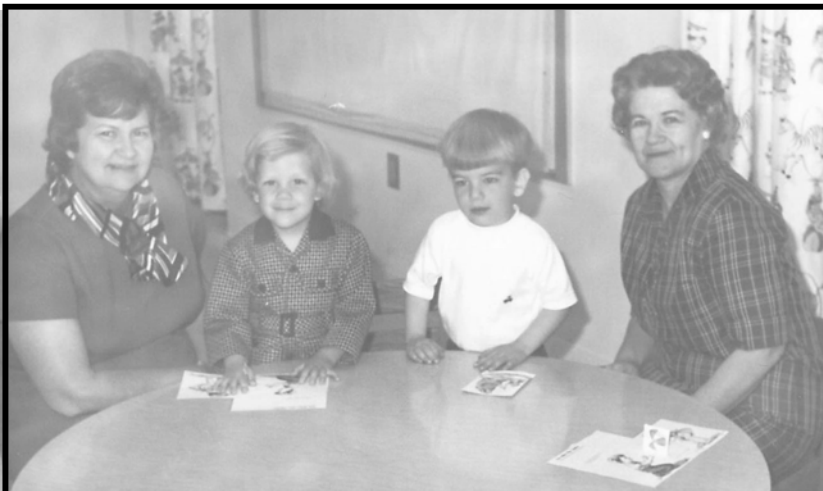
