Hello Everyone!

Doorstep is part of a committee that was recently formed with Topeka's emergency management team to create a disaster plan in case the Topeka Rescue Mission closes and to deal with the homeless camp north of the Mission. There are around 60-100 people living in what is referred to as Tent City. Our first priority is to deal with

the health crisis in the camp and get information. A large number of campers are on BNSF property and will be required to move soon.

A block party for the people staying in the homeless camp was held Friday, August 30th, with food, music, and resources available. The goal was to build rapport and create a safe environment in which to gather information from the

Tent City residents.
There were doctors and nurses on site to give
Hepatitis A and tetanus vaccines.

Now the committee will start creating a disaster plan to implement if the Mission closes. While we do not want that to happen, nor do we necessarily think it will, we need to have a plan in place just in case.


Trinity Lutheran Christmas Ornaments
