The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES


Advent One:


Paul compares the advent of Christ to the coming of dawn. We live our lives today in light of Christ's coming in the future.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 24:37-44

Jesus describes his second coming as a sudden, turbulent event that will bring about deep change to our normal, day-to-day lives. Therefore, he urges people to stay awake, be aware, and wait expectantly, because the Son of Man will come unannounced.

Jesus said to his disciples: ³⁷"As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. ³⁹They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴¹Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴²Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. ⁴³Be

For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. ⁴³Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."


THE LORD'S PRAYER
