As we have seen, Paul's message still speaks to us today and we have much to learn from the early church. In sharing the theme "Paul's Story- Our Story," I am inviting you to think about your story in the church. As Paul invites in his letters, the church is human. Therefore, we have memories that make us both excited and depressed, joyful and sad, surprising and boring. All of those are a part of the story that makes Trinity what it is. It can be good to think about our past and the stories that make us who we are today. Yet, we need to be mindful of being in the present and looking toward the future.

So how can you give a hopeful message about Trinity today? Is there a family member with a memory that you cherish that has not been to church in a while? Is there someone you know that had an argument in the church that might come back if reached out to by someone that cares?

These, as we have seen, were all happening in Paul's church and they happen in our church today. The question is if we are brave enough, like Paul, to "run the race" (1st Cor. 9:24) and to tell our story of the church. To tell what happens here at Trinity each week that touches you and makes you return each Sunday....what is your story?
