## Pastor's Letter

During our worship on June 27<sup>th</sup>, we commemorated St. John the Baptist and renewed our baptismal covenant. Like John did that day at Bethany, we testified to what we are called to do. The last part of our commitment in baptism states that we are "to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth." One of the ways that we have done this recently has been with the Operation Food Secure ministry in partnership with the Historic Old Town NIA. Every other week, Trinity and community

members have groceries to our neighbors. As of our last delivery, we had delivered 979 food boxes, 869 gallons of milk, 31,098 pounds of food or 25,915 meals. One of the main ways that Jesus communicated his ministry was in feeding. Indeed, beside the Resurrection, the only miracle that is told in all the Gospels is that of Jesus feeding the many. In some Gospels, this happens more than once. And we must not forget that on the last night that Jesus was with his disciples, he chose a simple meal of bread and wine to give us spiritual food for our faith.

In this coming year, I hope that we as a congregation can become more involved in serving our community and strive for justice and peace for all. In doing this, one of the charges that I am taking as a pastor is to connect us with more organizations and churches with which we can build partnerships. More relationships that we build with our community will help us in understanding how God is calling us to be the church in the heart of Topeka.

# August 8 151st Anniversary celebration


