

Doorstep offers many services to our neighbors in need. There are two programs in the community that are at the heart of, doing what we can to help. **Impact Avenues** is a program through the City of Topeka which helps homeless families with at least one school aged child. The families attend a series of classes, and once completed are placed into a home. Doorstep helps with rent assistance, gas vouchers, utility assistance car repairs, food, clothing and more. Doorstep also provides household & kitchen items when the family is moves into their new home. Items we need to

help these families are: (Gently used, not

new) Queen & Twin comfort-

ers and blankets (Impact helps with beds in these sizes) Pillows (new preferred) Small Household Appliances – toasters, mixers, coffee pots, Curtains, Silverware, Lamps

The other program is a new venture! It is MAP (Mobile Access Partnership), truly a community effort. In partnership with Valeo and **Topeka Rescue Mission** there will be a food trailer from TRM. health trailer from Stormont Vail, and the Shower & Laundry Trailer. The trailers move to different locations in the city each week to allow people who are homeless or in need of a shower, laundry services or bathrooms the opportunity to use the trailer. Doorstep provides clothing for men and women so people accessing the showers can have fresh clothing. We continue to stock our clothing room for clients who need that service, and provide clothing to the MAP shower trailer also. All items come from donations brought to Doorstep by our member congregations and the community at-large.

Our volunteers and staff are very proud to be a part of this wonderful new service. Currently, we are the only agency providing the clothing.
