WORD

EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN WORSHIP, ELCA 2006

FIRST READING: 1 KINGS 19:4-8

First Kings chapter 18 describes the contest between Elijah and the prophets of Baal. The contest proves that the LORD is God, and afterward Elijah orders the killing of the Baal prophets. Angered by the deaths of her prophets, Queen Jezebel threatens to kill Elijah. This reading finds Elijah fleeing, fatigued, and in utter despair.

⁴Elijah went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors."⁵Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. ⁷The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." ⁸He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

²⁵So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. ²⁶Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷and do not make room for the devil. ²⁸Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. ²⁹Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. ³⁰And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. ³¹Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, ³²and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. ^{5:1}Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, ²and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

1854 Nine people build cabin along Kansas River and found the City of Topeka

1860 State of Kansas is founded

1870 Pearson family offers their home for new Swedish Lutherans. The First Swedish Lutheran Church is founded as a member of the Augustana Synod. Pastor CJ Scheleen is called and they celebrate their first service on Tyler Street on Christmas Day.

1879 Kanas State Capitol Building begins construction from the West Wing.



1883 The second church on Tyler Street begins construction. To save money the church building is constructed by the men of the congregation along with Pastor Vestling.

1885 Second church is dedicated in time for Christmas Service.

1865 Washburn University is founded

1900

1903 Kanas State Capitol dome is finished.

1907 Congregation raises funds to build our first organ.

1922 Congregation changes their name to Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church.

1929 On January 19th, the second church building is lost in a fire. In three days, 80 members came together to buy current property and construction started on August 4th.

1930 Our third and current church building is completed on March 9th.


1944 Trinity becomes founding member of the Topeka Council of Churches and hosts Kansas Pan-Lutheran Unity Meetings.

1950

1955 Trinity Calls Rev. J. Edward Nelson. He will become the longest serving pastor retiring in 1982.

1962 Trinity becomes a member of the Lutheran Church in America and co-hosts the founding worship of the Central States Synod in Topeka.

Lutheran Home Association is founded with First Lutheran to provide economical housing to the elderly residents of Topeka.

1969 Fundraising and construction of an education and office building. Trinity Hall is built over a three year period and was dedicated on October 27th.

1980 Trinity is founding member of the Lutheran Fine Arts Council of Topeka.

1988 Trinity becomes a member church of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America creating the largest Lutheran denomination in the United States.

2005 Trinity unites Church Building and Trinity Hall.
