

Luther's German Mass

Martin Luther was asked by early Lutherans to produce a worship service that could unite all the churches that had separated from the Catholic Church. At the time, each church reformed the Mass according to their own ideas, which created a multiplication of ways to worship. On October 29, 1525, the German Mass was held in Wittenberg as composed by Luther. This was the first worship service to use the vernacular instead of Latin. It was approved by council on Christmas Day 1525 for all Lutherans to share in a common worship pattern and was printed for churches to use the following year.



Section of 95 Theses

- 39 It is very difficult, even for the most learned of theologians, to teach both the good of indulgences and to have people amend their lives from sin.
- 40 A Christian who is truly penitent seeks and loves to amend their lives for the sins they have committed. Indulgences, however, gives people a cheap grace, one that is won without any effort.
- 41 Papal indulgences must be used with caution, or people will think that it would be easier to buy an indulgence than to do other works of love.
- 42 Christians should be taught that the pope does not intend for indulgences to replace the other means of grace and mercy offered in the church.
- 43 Christians should be taught that those who give to the poor or lends to the needy, does a better deed than those who rely on indulgences.
- 44 Because love grows by our acts of love toward others, man becomes better. Man does not become better by means of indulgences, but is merely freed from sin without thought.
- 45 Christians should be taught that when they pass a needy man and do nothing about his condition, yet gives money for indulgences, does not give themselves reward, but only God's wrath.



EPISTLE: GALATIANS 2:16-21

¹⁶However, we know that a person isn't made righteous by the works of the Law but rather through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ. We ourselves believed in Christ Jesus so that we could be made righteous by the faithfulness of Christ and not by the works of the Law—because no one will be made righteous by the works of the Law. ¹⁷But if it is discovered that we ourselves are sinners while we are trying to be made righteous in Christ, then is Christ a servant of sin? Absolutely not! ¹⁸If I rebuild the very things that I tore down, I show that I myself am breaking the Law. ¹⁹I died to the Law through the Law, so that I could live for God. ²⁰I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. And the life that I now live in my body, I live by faith, indeed, by the faithfulness of God's Son, who loved me and gave himself for me. ²¹I don't ignore the grace of God, because if we become righteous through the Law, then Christ died for no purpose.



THE CREED

- P Let us confess our faith with the words of the Apostle's Creed.
- C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
