Pastor's Letter

"Let us build a house where hands will reach beyond the wood and stone to heal and strengthen, serve and teach, and live the Word they've known." -Marty Haugen, "All Are Welcome" (ELW 641)

The Lenten season is often when we take time to reflect upon our faith as a community. This journey of learning during Lent has been a tradition during which many of you have participated in a Bible study or adult forum series. While we often focus on the intellectual expansion, what if we share our collective wisdom as a faith community? What if we decide to share our memories in this journey of faith? What if that came from the very sanctuary in which we worship each Sunday?

During this Lenten season, we will be taking a journey of faith right in our pews. We will be using our sanctuary as a way to deepen our understanding of scripture and the collective wisdom that our space has brought us as a faith community. In starting this process of historical preservation and restoration for the next three years, we have to realize that our sanctuary is not just wood, plaster, and pews. All of the things that surround us on a Sunday morning speak to who we are as a worship community. In the song All Are Welcome, the fourth verse reminds us that this building is not just a place. This place is built by the memories of faith that

all of us have encountered here. This church is the place where we have been nourished in our faith, taught to live faithfully, and sent out to do God's work in the world. Despite our ideas that the physical items themselves (your seat in the pews, the windows, the baptismal font) are important, it is really the meaning and memory that we have attached to these things in our lives of faith that really touch our hearts and bring us closer to God.

Therefore, we will be focusing on a unique aspect of the church building to highlight each Sunday as a form of a Lenten devotional. We will also be asking each of you to provide your own memories around those sacred items in our sanctuary. In this, we will remember why we are doing this mission of historic preservation and restoration. We will remember that these items hold in them both biblical and theological meaning. We will revive all those precious memories of faith that have been formed by the people of God in and around this space we call the church building. We will understand that we are restoring not a place of just wood and stone, but a place of healing, service, teaching and loving in the past, the present, and for our future as a congregation.



Doorstep

Thank you to everyone who donated soup and crackers during our **Souper Bowl Sunday** collection! We know that a can of soup can be a meal or two, and your generous donations helped stock our pantry, and provide meals for your neighbors in need!

We are now firmly in the second half of Doorstep's 55th Anniversary year, June 1, 2021 – May 31, 2022! If you haven't heard we are raising funds for our 55th Anniversary Fund, specifically to replace the 60+ year old HVAC system in our building! We received our original bid just after the beginning of COVID, and our estimate was \$150,000. Unfortunately, with all of the changes COVID has brought, we now need to raise at least \$180,000!

February 2022 RE: Leadership Transition





Dear TRM supporter,

As Barry Feaker, Executive Director of the Topeka Rescue Mission (TRM) approaches his 36th year of service to those experiencing homelessness and poverty in the greater Topeka Community, he has decided the time has come for the next generation of leadership to help TRM continue to grow and advance in its mission to address the ever-changing landscape of homelessness and poverty.

In Spring of 2021, to enhance TRM operations while addressing the increasing complex needs of those we serve, a new position was created, Senior Director of Ministry Operations. La Manda Broyles, at the time a principal for Topeka Public Schools and volunteer TRM board member, felt called to leave both positions and was hired for the new position. Her leadership experience, strong belief in the mission and Christ-centered focus of TRM, along with knowing she had been called to this ministry made her the perfect fit and she joined the team in June 2021, focused on advancing the work of TRM.

After significant examination regarding succession planning and discernment related to the future of the organization, the TRM board of directors unanimously voted at the December 2021 board meeting to initiate the leadership transition and promote La Manda into the position of Executive Director for TRM effective Spring of 2022. Barry Feaker said, "I am very excited about the future of TRM. After seeking God for my successor, I firmly believe La Manda has been assigned by God to lead TRM into the next phase of ministry in the greater Topeka community. La Manda is a visionary leader who will ensure the heart and core of the Mission remain focused on serving those in need while sharing the love of Jesus Christ to all."

TRM Board President, Hal Smith said, "The TRM board is grateful for all Barry has done in serving the homeless and the Topeka community for the past 36 years. We look forward to all he will continue to do in the future. We are excited to welcome La Manda into the role of executive director. Her leadership experience, passion for those we serve and our mission, coupled with her commitment to following Christ, ensure that she will be instrumental in leading TRM and the complex work of addressing homelessness in our community."

Regarding this opportunity, La Manda said, "I am honored to serve the TRM family and Topeka community as TRM's next Executive Director. Being a vessel for the Lord's work on Earth to bring hope to others is something that is deeply rooted in my heart." By transferring the responsibilities associated with the executive director position, Barry will continue to assist the ministry areas of strategic development and consultation. In this role he will serve as an advisor to the Executive Director and provide ministry wide spiritual support to TRM staff, volunteers, and donors. Feaker will also continue community networking on behalf of TRM and provide strategic consultation support to other ministries and communities.

There will be a community gathering, reflecting on Barry's 36 years at TRM and giving an opportunity to welcome La Manda. More information will be forthcoming. We invite you to join TRM as it spends time in prayer for this transition and the work God has called us to, helping assist those who are homeless and impoverished. 
