

SECOND READING: 1ST CORINTHIANS 13:4-13



P Since we have such great hope in your promises, O God, we lift these and all of our prayers to you in confidence and faith; through Jesus Christ our Savior.






OFFERTORY PRAYER

- C Amen.


THE LORD'S PRAYER


