Pastor's Letter

"There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens..." Ecclesiastes 3:1

The season after Pentecost has normally been what we call the "low season" of the church year. Summer comes, families go away for vacations, and the lectionary seems to focus on random scriptures that follow no direct theme like the rest of the year. While some pastors look forward to this time because it means that the busy nature that the church gets itself into is no more. If one goes to the scripture passage above, it will highlight how in our faith life we normally need this. We need times in our life that are busy and exciting, but we also need times of rest and silence. Our faith life requires balance to be wholly in touch with our human nature.

Church is a yearround dedication, and we will be having activities throughout this season. We will be having some exciting worship opportunities with "Our Favorite Hymns" and "God on Broadway". We will finally be completing the Youth Room and dedicating that this summer with a Messy Church Worship Service. We have activities planned with Doorstep and our NIA to get our community together. We have many ways for you to be involved in our church this summer and I hope that you will be active in them.

In August, we will worship with "God on Broadway" (a liturgy that incorporates scriptures and musicals together in a worship service). This



worship series has been developed by United Methodist churches and Pastor Andrew is happy to bring this worship series to Trinity from his experience with them back in North Carolina.

Council Highlights June 13

- We reviewed Service Sunday held June 12 at Doorstep. A thank-you letter will be sent to Asbury-Mt. Olive for their participation with us with the hope of partnering with them on future projects.
- Marcy Carlson presented information about Real Time
 Health Plan prescription drug
 plan. Voluntary participation
 by individual members in the
 drug plan would work similar
 to how the Dillons reward program worked. Council agreed
 to allow Marcy to make this
 program available to interested members.
- Fifth Sunday Special on July 31 will be a "Budget Booster" to help with the General Fund deficit.
- Congregational Life Commit-

- tee met June 5 and recommended an emphasis on favorite hymns of Sweden, Germany, England, and the USA beginning June 26. In August the theme will be "God on Broadway". Broadway musicals and scriptures will be brought together during worship.
- A hymn sing the 1st Sunday of each month will resume in August; members will be able to request hymns.
- Quilters have no money to pay for batting recently purchased for \$390. Council recommended taking money out of the Memorial account to cover this expense.
- Coffee Hour location was reviewed and will continue in current space between church and Trinity Hall.



Doorstep

This July we are rolling all of our summer events into one month! We have Christmas in July collections for our adopted families and our 3rd Summer Cash Bash to earn matching funds!

Last December Doorstep assisted 259 households involving 822 individuals with Christmas gifts, food and gift cards. Each year we celebrate "Christmas in July" to get a jump start on collecting new items for our annual Christmas adoption! Our goal is to help alleviate some of the strain during the holidays by also collecting items mid-year. Doorstep will adopt 260 households with 800+ individuals this December through the Christmas Bureau. We have created a more specific list of items this year, based on the requested items our families listed last Christmas. Our collection focus for Christmas in July is nonseasonal items that should be easily available this time of year.

Each school-aged child we adopt receives school supplies and a

backpack, and each household receives a blanket, and a health kit filled with hygiene products, and wrapped with a new bath towel, hand towel and washcloth! Each child receives one bigger toy as their gift, and other smaller items are available along with games, books, stuffed animals, stocking stuffers etc.

You can bring your Christmas donations to worship in July (if your congregation is open), or to Doorstep, Monday – Friday, 8am – 3pm. Our 3rd Summer Cash Bash has our generous, anonymous donor offering up to \$15,000 in match money if we receive donations of \$20,000 or more, during the month of July! Please note your congregation and 'Summer Cash Bash' on your donations so we apply it to the matching total! Donations typically drop during the summer months, and this will help Doorstep continue to operate, pay our bills, and help our neighbors in need pay theirs.



Beginning August 7th, we will resume our monthly singalongs before worship. You can call or email the office to let us know your favorites. In addition, there will be inserts in some of the July bulletins on which you can note your favorites and put in the offering plate.
