Pastor's Letter

"Don't you know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you? Don't you know that you have the Holy Spirit from God, and you don't belong to yourselves? You have been bought and paid for, so honor God with your body."

1st Corinthians 6:19-20

I am sure many have heard this scripture, perhaps as a teenager or later in college years and most likely by a parental figure. Paul was upset that Christians were joining pagan feasts and other activities, but we have often heard this verse from another perspective. Starting with the tent revivals and evangelist speakers in the late 1800s, we increasingly saw these verses as cautions against what we call vices — things that take away our time, our money, our concentration in what we are doing in this world as Christians. While we try to scandalize vices like drinking, the truth is that many of us have vices for us to think about how we might better live our lives. (Go back to Luther on being sinners and saints...) As an example: during COVID, the National Institute of Health surveyed 7,700 people about the longterm effects of the pandemic. They found that 36% stopped thinking about eating healthy, 44% reported more snacking, and 27% reported a noted weight gain. 37% of those gained more than 5lbs and 11% gained more than 10lbs. Despite all the do-it-yourself articles and videos of how to take exercise back home with you, only 18% Americans reported losing weight. Therefore, due to mental health or inaction at home, food became a vice. This is also not your pastor acting

like I am better for my own journev has been with those of you that have added weight during the pandemic. While eating does not seem to be as scandalous as other things we think of as a vice, we must think about it in relation to the world. The United States is one of the most overweight nations while many are starving, particularly in places like Africa. The war in Ukraine has caused a shortage of wheat so many people can't even make bread. Yet, one of the most foundational things that we do as a faith community is come together for a meal every week where all can be fed. This food is not just spiritual, but it is calling us as Christians to make sure that all are cared for in this world.

So the question becomes how can we be more just with our bodies (much like Paul is talking about) and change our ways to improve not only ourselves but the community around us? Could it be as simple as a little exercise in our lives? As a matter of fact, a first step in the right direction is that easy. When we exercise and lose weight, it helps to drive down the number of calories our bodies need to run. Then we are able to consume less food so that we can share that with the world. Take one small step...or a walk down the block with us this month as we begin our "Faithful and Fit" program. Join us as we improve our minds with books and our bodies with a little exercise together at the church and in our neighborhood.

Council Highlights July 18

- ◆ Reflection on Mission Statement: "Caring for Neighbors" Council members spoke of current ways the congregation is caring for neighbors and possible ways to reach out in the future.
- ◆ Continued conversation on the future budget with treasurer Bob Kobbeman. Currently there are 24 giving units (families/single persons). Discussion about growing these giving units and adding giving units from our current membership base. Response to 5th Sunday Special (July 31) Budget Booster was minimal.
- Discussion about resuming communion at the altar rail.
 Will seek input from the congregation. Coffee hour will remain in the current location.
- Discussed possibility of naming community garden in honor of Helen and Walt Laughlin.

The Lutheran Home Association invites you to an open house Sunday, September 18th, at 12:00pm, convening at Martin Creek Clubhouse. A light lunch will be provided. A short presentation of our restructuring/remodeling project will be shared, followed by a tour of units in both Luther Place and Martin Creek.

Luther Place 1 and 2 are lowincome subsidized housing apartments for 200 plus residents. Martin Creek provides an additional 121 market-rate town homes and apartments for Topeka residents.

These units are run by the Topeka Lutheran Home Association, Inc, a 55-year-old venture between Trinity Lutheran Church and First Lutheran Church. This joint venture provides over 320 Topeka residents with safe and affordable housing every night.

TLHA has recently completed a four-year, \$9,030,000 project that included ownership restructuring, refinancing high interest debt, and over \$3,380,000 in renovation to Luther Place 1 and 2. Renovations included complete replacement of heating and air conditioning equipment, upgrade of exterior finishes in both buildings as well as plumbing replacement and interior finish upgrades in Luther Place 1.




In *Accidental Saints*, New York Times best-selling author Nadia Bolz-Weber invites readers into a surprising encounter with what she calls "a religious but not-so-spiritual life." She was valedictorian of the 1950 class of Russellville High School.

Helen learned about a man named Rev. Walter George Laughlin through their work in the ALC Parish Education Committee and went on a blind date as a result. They went bowling. They united in marriage on April 11, 1964, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Lohman, MO.

Before marriage she enjoyed traveling with friends around the USA and was the fun aunt to her dear nieces and nephews. During this time she contributed to the establishment of Our

Savior's Lutheran Church in Jefferson City. She was employed by the Cole County Library, Mitzie's Hat Shop, the Missouri Division of Employment Security, and GMAC. She was also employed at True Value in Hampton, NE, and various other places.

She was a partner in ministry with Walter at parishes in Cushing and Oklahoma City, OK, Dannebrog, Hampton, and Byron, NE, and Concordia, KS. She participated in the life of the church at St. Paul's in Lohman, Trinity in Topeka, Kansas, and Joy Lutheran in Tulsa, in addition to the above parishes and was involved in quilting, bible study, WELCA, Sunday school, volunteering, and choir. Walter and Helen launched a community garden at Trinity.

Helen was a skilled and creative gardener and seamstress. She shared her knowledge and fruits of her labor and tenacious work ethic with her children, grandchildren, and others.

Survivors include her husband, Rev. Walter Laughlin, Tulsa, OK; three children, Stephanie (Michael) Mueller of Tulsa OK, John Laughlin (Julie Suhr) of The Plains, OH, Michele (Bob) Peck of Waterloo, IA, six grandchildren: Elsa Mueller (Anthony Filipas), Greta Mueller, Alane Suhr (Austin Alexander), Meredith Suhr, Alison Peck, and Ryan Peck, and one sister, Viola Gordon of Sedalia, MO.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two sisters and three brothers-in-law, Nelda (Oscar) Strobel, Norma (Delbert) Liescheidt, and Donald Gordon.

Visitation was held Sunday, August 7, 2022, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Lohman, MO with funeral service at 4 p.m. and burial at St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery, officiated by Pastor David Viles.


