Deacon Dave Mareske is a rostered minister of Word and Service in the ELCA. For the past 22 years he has served as the Executive Director of Hollis Renewal Center, a retreat center in Bonner Springs KS (just south of the Kansas Speedway).

Hollis comprises 153 acres, five miles of hiking trails, a prayer labyrinth and seven buildings that can be reserved for personal or group use. There are 13 beds total in five different cabins, two cabins with complete bathrooms and kitchens and three tiny cabins. The summer Day Camp program welcomes kids



from underserved areas in the Kansas City metropolitan area under scholarship and kids from local congregations who pay a nominal fee. This combination of racial, religious, and economic diversity lives out the gospel and has created life-long friendships. In addition to the Day Camp, Hollis operates a year-round LEGO donation center that

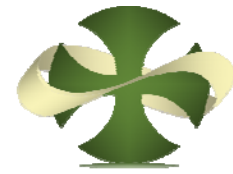
recycles LEGOs into kits for children in the CASA program of Jackson and Wyandotte counties. LEGOs are donated, sorted, washed and recombined into kits as gifts to these children at the first meeting with the CASA volunteer and on their birthdays.

Hollis' next event is the Winter Art Fair, where a variety of local artists show their creations and a portion of their sales goes to support Hollis. The event is Saturday, December 3, 10 AM to 6 PM with wine and cheese from 4-6 PM.

### Support for Hollis

About 30% of our budget comes from individuals and groups donating to use Hollis, 5% come from the synod and congregations in the area, 15% comes from grants and fundraisers and 50% comes from individuals who want to see this ministry of hospitality remain sustainable and ready to welcome the next guest.
