Pastor's Letter

"... You belong to God's household. As God's household, you are built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Christ Jesus as the cornerstone. The whole church is joined together in him and it grows up into a temple dedicated to the Lord." - Ephesians 2:19c-21

During November, we focused on stewardship in the congregation and getting back to basics. By now, we should have your pledge cards so we can begin work on our budget for next year. We should also start see Council liaisons taking over committee meetings and your funeral plans should start collecting in the office records.

In December, we will be centering our thoughts and energies on how we lead as a congregation by taking a deep dive into Spiral Dynamics that I have learned from Pastor Magrey deVega to see what we can discover about ourselves and how each of us functions and leads in the church. I will be asking everyone to take a simple test. Once the results show our leadership styles, we will talk about the different leadership types that are often found in churches and how we can better work together. This insight will help us look at conflict and how our different types of leadership causes us to fumble in our leadership in groups when types that are not compatible come together. Advent will allow us lots of introspection about how we can best use our different type of leadership to function better as a congregation.

I hope that you have seen these monthly series as a sign that we are taking steps to get back on our feet after COVID. Many congregations post-COVID finding that they are totally different churches than what they were. I hope that we can start our new year as a congregation on looking to the future and able to restart our mission as a church on better footing than when we started this pandemic. The simple fact is that as we start the new year, we will be a smaller church due to deaths over the past two years. Everyone in the congregation will have to step up and be a part of our revival. The next year will be not only critical for our congregation but many congregations across our synod are wondering if it is their time to close. My hope in all this work we have done for the past two months is that we will not be a congregation to ponder that question. But the catch is that Trinity needs you, to be more present, involved, and to volunteer when you can. Trinity is going to need you for committee meetings to provide insight and planning. The first word of our motto is "Together" and this next year will prove if we are together as a congregation and if we can find our path out of the pandemic away from just surviving into a place of thriving as a congregation and it will all be up to every one of you.

Council Highlights Nov. 14

- After further discussion a motion was passed allowing Pr.
 Andrew to discuss with Pr.
 Dave Whetter (Bishop's Assistant) our willingness to discuss the idea of joining with Grace Lutheran, Osage City in finding a full time pastor to serve both congregations.
- Saint Lucia celebration to be held Friday, Dec. 16, beginning with a potluck meal at 6pm followed by a special candlelight service.
