Pastor's Letter

"The desert and the dry land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom like the crocus. They will burst into bloom, and rejoice with joy and singing." Isaiah 35:1-2

In the season of Lent, we allow ourselves to travel with Jesus through the desert. Our theme for the sermons this Lent will be focused on "The Blessings of the Desert." How we can find hope through this season. Yet, while we often focus on the brokenness, the sadness, the starkness of being in the desert, we need to remind ourselves that Jesus was not alone (and I am not speaking of his encounter with Satan). God was with Jesus along the journey in the desert just like Jesus is with us in the times in our lives when we feel like we are in the desert.

Being in the desert with Jesus is not a fun experience though. While we settle into the sand, our days are complicated by feelings that don't seem altogether very spiritual. Deep annoyance.

Rehearsals of old fights. Anger at friends who are, in our defense, pretty frustrating sometimes. Our bodies ache. We are consumed by somebody else's problems and we are fairly certain their lives are rushing toward despair.

So we wait. We wait for God to come to us as the crocus in the desert. As that blessing hidden in the sands of our lives. We find that God never leaves. That God's presence is with us even on the darkest days. When life is headed downhill, I tend to wait for God to meet me there or show me a blessing I had never seen before.

When Lent rolls around every year, we are offered a chance to stop waiting. We get to walk with Jesus and see that God is with us in all the brokenness and darkness of our lives. We are in the part of the story when Jesus is an arrow pointed straight at his own end. He will die. But first, he will suffer and be

betrayed; religious and political structures will conspire and conform to great evil; nothing will be peace on earth or goodwill to all humankind. No wisemen and starry nights. Lent is about the journey through the desert to the Cross. The fact that God never leaves Jesus is the testament that Jesus will never leave us. We are the crocus; we are the blessing in the desert for all to see. All we are called to do is walk through the desert with Jesus and see the blessings that we are. That is what it means to be the blessing in the desert this season.



NOTICE: SPECIAL MEETING FOR CONSTITUTION AMENDMENTS

On April 2 after worship, the Congregation Council calls all voting members to meet to discuss two types of amendments to our Constitution. The first set of amendments is to bring sections into conformity with the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as most recently amended by the Churchwide

Assembly. The second type of amendment is to bring current the section on our church's committee structure. A printed copy of proposed amendments is available upon request to the TLC office. The proposed revisions to the committee structure section is shared below with the changes highlighted.

Chapter 13.

CONGREGATION COMMITTEES

C13.01. The officers of this congregation and the pastor shall constitute the *Executive Committee*.

C13.02. A *Nominating Committee* of six voting members of this congregation, two of whom, if possible, shall be outgoing members of the Congregation Council, shall be elected at the annual meeting for a term of one year. Members of the Nominating Committee are not eligible for consecutive re-election.

C13.03. An *Audit Committee* of three voting members shall be elected by the Congregation. Term of office shall be three years, with one member elected each year. Members shall be eligible for re-election.

C13.04. When a pastoral vacancy occurs, a *Call Committee* of six voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Term of office will terminate upon installation of the newly called pastor.

C13.05. Other committees of this congregation may be formed, as the need arises, by decision of the Congregation Council. Duties of such committees shall be specified in the continuing resolutions.

C13.05.01 Congregational committees shall be those committees which enable this congregation and the Congregation Council to fulfill the statement of purpose as specified in Chapter 4 of this constitution. Such committees shall include but are not limited to *Worship and Music*, *Witness*, *Learning*, *Service*, *Finance and Stewardship*, and *Property*. *Administration*, *Community Relations*, *Congregational Life*, *Maintenance*, and *Spiritual Care*. One or more members A member of the Congregation Council shall be appointed to serve as chair of to each congregational committee. All congregational committees shall be responsible to the Congregation Council.

C13.06. The pastor of this congregation shall be an ex officio member of all committees and boards of the congregation.






Donations not required however greatly appreciated.
