Pastor's Letter

"Don't remember the prior things; don't ponder ancient history. Look! I'm doing a new thing; now it sprouts up; don't you recognize it? I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness." -Isaiah 43:18-19

The leaving of a pastor can often result in many feelings and emotions about the experience that a congregation has had during that call. Some in the congregation will share feelings of loss and mourning during these next couple of months remembering the good times. Some in the congregation will be renewed and joyful over thinking about what the future may hold. And some will have a mixture of all of these feelings. In my leaving this call, I would ask that you not remember me as a perfect or as a horrible pastor, but just remember me as an honest pastor that tried my best to ensure that Trinity has a tomorrow in ministry. That was the challenge of coming to Trinity at the beginning. There were several people that stated the church wouldn't have another six months or asked me when I planned to start work on closing the congregation down. My response to them then and my response to you today is that I was not called to Trinity to find an ending, but I was called because you all have a future in ministry as a people of faith.

While I cannot comment on what direction Trinity might take, I might have some pastoral recommendations for things to remember during this time of change. The first is to not fight one another in this time of transition. There will be moments when you will feel different about future directions. In Paul's words (2 Timothy 2:24), don't argue, but be kind to one another, share your views, and have patience with each other. By Luther, let us always remember to view those we disagree with in the most positive light. The second point is to not forget those who are not in the pews. Keep up with our homebound members as they dearly love Trinity and there is now a system in place to preserve those connections. Remember that we now have a whole group of people that watch Trinity online every week. Build on that and reach out to them so that they feel included in all that Trinity is doing. The third point is to remember the children. Jesus in his ministry uses children three times (Matthew 18:1 -10, Matthew 19:13-15, Luke 18 15 -17) to demonstrate what heaven should look like. Therefore, if Sunday morning is our taste of heaven on earth, then the children have to be a part of that vision. When I first came, I remember people telling me that we didn't have any

children. In some regards, that was true because there was nothing for them, but there were children in our community. Together, we created a space for them, a Sunday for them to play with the rest of us, and even had 19 of them this past Easter. Therefore, from the deepest well of my heart, I hope that Trinity can continue to provide a space for them to grow in their faith and most important to provide a place where they know God (and you) love them.

So while God has now called us to different paths, let's not forget to look for the new paths in our lives on the journey ahead. We know that God will provide even if we feel like we have been thrown in the wilderness. Trinity has been here before and I have faith that this will not be the last. Farewell my friends in Christ for this part of the journey and I hope to see all the great work that God will bless for Trinity in the future.
