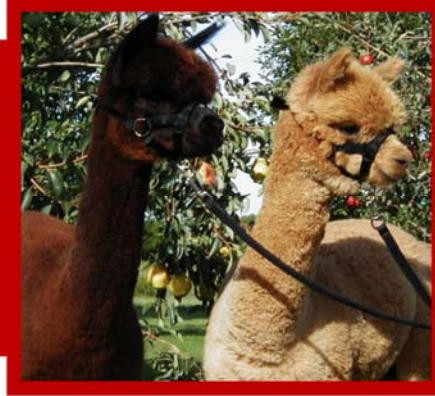

Food Room Needs

The need for food for our neighbors has increased dramatically. This year, we have spent \$38,000 on food to keep our shelves stocked (we projected only \$8,000 being needed), and may very well spend \$50,000 or more by year end. We have already exceeded the total number of households assisted with food in 2022 by 448 households, 1,135 individuals and 13,770 pounds, and we have another 3 months until year-end! Currently, we are in need of the following items:

- Beans, canned & dried
- Boxed Potatoes
- Canned Fruit
- Hand Can Openers
- Egg Noodles
- Milk, canned & powdered
- Oatmeal
- Pancake Mix
- Pasta, boxed pasta, spaghetti, Spaghetti O's, macaroni & cheese, ravioli
- Peanut Butter
- Peas
- Pork & Beans
- Soups, chicken noodle, vegetable, tomato, cream of mushroom
- Tuna
