






- 5 Mighty victim from the sky, hell's fierce pow'rs beneath you lie; you have conquered in the fight, you have brought us life and light. Alleluia!

FIRST READING: EXODUS 16:2-4, 9-15

²The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. ³The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger."

⁴Then the LORD said to Moses, "I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not."

⁹Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, 'Draw near to the LORD, for he has heard your complaining.'" ¹⁰And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. ¹¹The LORD spoke to Moses and said, ¹²"I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the LORD your God.'"

¹³In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. ¹⁴When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. ¹⁵When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, "It is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

²³So God commanded the clouds above and opened the doors of heaven,

²⁴raining down manna upon them to eat and giving them grain from heaven.


⁷But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people."

⁹(When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? ¹⁰He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) ¹¹The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. ¹⁴We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. ¹⁵But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

C receive our prayer.







From the CSS newsletter:

We extend our prayers to include members of our Companion Synod Team travelling for a visitation with our Synod partner, the Kotte District of Papua New Guinea. Rev. Gary Teske, Rev. Aimée Appell, Rev. Daniel Lilienkamp, and Ms. Joyce Benedict depart August 11th. During their trip four synods will meet in consultation and then with their respective companion synods.

Rev. Teske writes, "We will be spending in excess of 25 hours airborne, not counting

the time in transit through airports, and that is just one way! We have not been together since 2019, mainly due to the Pandemic. During our visit, we have new leadership to meet and develop relationships with as well as some old friends to catch up with. We will be sharing our faith and worshipping together to affirm one another's faith and ministry. Language will be an issue in some situations as not everyone in PNG speaks English and we will need to listen carefully in order to gain understanding, not just of what is being said but the context of the differences in our cultures."

The team will be gathering examples and expressions of their companion's faith that

can enrich us in the Central States Synod. Acknowledging that we have resources, money

being one of them, that they do not possess the team will

also look at concrete ways that we can assist them in their ministry without fostering dependency.
