Pastor's Letter

"O come, O King of nations, come, O Cornerstone that binds in one: refresh the hearts that long for you; restore the broken, make us new"

Dear Partners in Ministry,

Advent is a season of hopeful anticipation for the revelation of God's all-powerful love. In addition to launching the start of a new liturgical year, Advent also marks the start of an intentional time of prayer and reflection. For many, the solemnity of Advent can get lost in the hustle and bustle of the holiday season. Perhaps that is why we light candles on the Advent wreath. As the rest of the world rushes to "deck the halls" we bask in the waiting. It is also why we frequently cry out, "Come, Lord Jesus." Inviting the long-awaited Messiah to come into our lives and our world, trusting that God is about to do something new and exciting.

As we once again prepare for the Christ child's appearance, may we seriously consider how we might prepare ourselves for the unexpected ways that God comes to us. During Advent we open our hearts to God's presence in our lives. If you create space for prayer and worship this Advent, you just may discover that there are few times in which the lectionary readings are more beautiful, more moving, or more meaningful. For Advent witnesses to our trust that God indeed bears all of our afflictions and comes in Jesus to heal us. Whatever pain we have, whatever desolation we bear, God hears and responds. "Come, Lord Jesus."

As you prepare for Christmas this year we encourage you to make space for Jesus. Consider spending time with the lectionary texts or experience anew the intentionality of Advent by attending church every weekend in December, in-person or online. Take a break from the "to do lists" and immerse yourself in



the beautiful musical liturgy of Holden Evening Prayer Service, joining us for one of our Mid-week Advent worship services that will take place, on-line or in person, on Wednesdays December 4th (5 pm, followed by a potluck meal and Christmas light viewing) and 11th (posted on-line at 5 pm for viewing as your schedule allows.)

Advent offers a refreshing alternative to the commercialization of the holiday season precisely because it creates space where we can give voice to our pain, loss, and grief even as we prepare for the joyous news of the Christ child's birth. We invite you, especially those who are challenged to find joy in the "hap, happiest time of the year," to be intentional this Advent season about your own spiritual self-care.

Trinity will also host a Blue Christmas/Longest Night worship service on December 18th at 12 PM noon, (in-person and posted on-line for viewing when your schedule allows.) This ecumenical worship service intentionally creates space for those for whom the holidays are difficult due to the death of a beloved family member or friend, financial insecurity, illness, loneliness, or other reasons. Please consider inviting a friend, neighbor, or loved one who may struggle to find joy during the holidays.

The deliberate, hopeful pace of the Advent season concludes with our candlelight Christmas Eve worship services at 4 PM, December 24, 2024. We hope to see you there!

Second Town Hall Nov. 17

Treasurer Bob Kobbeman said TLC needs \$125,000 – 130,000 to continue current operations. He projected that by 12/31/24 our operating income may be \$21,000 – 25,000 below this amount. Our biggest expense is maintenance. Bob Horton spoke on behalf of the Transition Team. They continue to work on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Completion of the MSP is on hold until Trinity's fu-

ture direction is defined. To get a sense of what that future direction could be, several questions were posed. Questions included: Why do you come to Trinity?, What is our mission and how do we carry it out? Will maintaining our building prevent us from serving our neighbors?

We appreciate all who participated in this meeting, and we thank Pr. Dave Whetter, Bishop's Associate for providing input on future options.

Plan to attend the Annual Meeting of the Congregation January 19 and the next Town Hall January 26. Prior to those meetings, exploration of options include sharing space and expenses with another entity and selling the building and renting space from the new owner to continue worshiping here. Include Trinity in your daily prayers as we discern what our future direction is. What is God calling us to do and how do we do it?

- We need \$125,000 to \$135,000 annually to operate the church. We have met \$125,000 in collections in just two of six recent years. Bob K projected we will end short in 2024. We need to emphasize the need to cover operating expenses, and not just special projects. Pastor Barb offered that we need to consider options. Bob added we need to formalize our approach to explore options.
- The Congregational Life report was omitted from the minutes of 10/8/24, but the report was in the agenda. The welcome center is on hold until the elevator is operational.
- Maintenance reported a redbud tree may need to be removed near the parking lot. Locks have been placed on outside water and electrical outlets. Marcy, Ben, & John Carlson have been doing many maintenance projects; thanks and appreciation is expressed.


Our November donation included 298 items totaling 283.1 pounds!
